The sessions and workshops provide a means for participants to explore novel approaches to integrating plants into the classroom and to reach out and broaden participation in science. With a variety of formats from discussions to workshops, the Forum is a must for teachers and also for researchers who are interested in making their results accessible to students of biology at all levels. The global significance of plants continues to grow. It is therefore vital that plant scientists and their professional societies work to ensure that plants are represented in the undergraduate and graduate curriculum, as well as in science outreach initiatives.

Workshop topics presented by education and public outreach institutions at previous Forums include: £cientific Inquiry through Developing New Inquiry Units, Techniques of Digital Image Enhancement for Teaching and Research, Integrating Digital Imaging, Into the Laboratory Curriculum, Wisconsin Fast Plants, Using the Original and Newly Improved Versions of C-Fern® in Inquiry-based Teaching, Developing a Hands-on Distance Education Laboratory in Nonmajors General Biology, and Strategies for Guiding Student Investigations.
